RE: FY 2017 HNRTC Budget Recommendation and Project Execution Plan Update

Dear Ms. Charboneau:

The Hanford Natural Resource Trustee Council's fiscal year 2017 (FY 2017) budget recommendation is \$7.839 million, based on our Project Execution Plan (PEP).

As you know, the Hanford Natural Resource Trustee Council (HNRTC or Council) is conducting a Natural Resource Damage Assessment (NRDA) for the Hanford Site as required by the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA). In that effort last year, we developed and approved the PEP (May 2014). The PEP provides DOE with a funding baseline and milestones for completion of the NRDA by 2024. Attached is the recommended FY 2017 HNRTC Budget Summary, along with the approved updated PEP (March 2015), which updates the funding baselines found in the PEP Table 4.1.

In updating the PEP we focused on HNRTC accomplishments in FY 2014 and actual funding received in FY 2015. The FY 2015 funding to the HNRTC was more than \$3 million below the FY 2015 Council budget request. To account for this budget shortfall, the HNRTC chose to implement a "bow-wave" approach to updating the funding baseline for the PEP, which is the basis for the FY(+2) funding request for this year. The Council agreed to conduct a detailed review of the injury study costs documented in Table 4.2 this summer. This analysis and continued discussion with DOE will guide a more robust update of the PEP in FY 2016.

Planned work in FY 2017 continues the iterative process of completing ongoing injury studies and implementing new injury studies identified in the Hanford NRDA Injury Assessment Plan (IAP), and Technical Work Group (TWG) work plans. The FY 2017 scope also includes planning for early restoration projects. FY 2017 scope includes assessment planning, injury and service loss studies, restoration planning, technical analysis, project management, information

management and administration. The PEP provides further information regarding the scope, schedule and cost estimates for these activities.
